The Karst Conservation Fund (KCF) supports projects which further the aims of the Australian Speleological Federation Inc. in protecting the cave and karst environment of Australia.

The KCF is currently supporting several projects:

- The Nullarbor Campaign is directed at preventing the Western Green Energy Hub proposals to develop wind and solar infrastructure on vast areas of the Nullarbor Plain. Currently, it also funds the National Heritage Listing nomination contract and supports cave conservation projects such as Goat Cave protection and collection of cave biota. Further expenditure could include expenditure on travel for political lobbying, publicity and production of campaign publications. This is the current major ASF conservation campaign.
- **Cave Invertebrate Conservation Project** supports Dr Jessica Marsh in an Early Career Industry Fellowship through an ARC Linkage Program at Adelaide University. Initial studies have found a large number of new troglobitic invertebrates from Goat Cave on the Nullarbor Plain.
- Ghost Bat Project "The Macroderma Initiative: conserving ghost bats and informing development". Dr Nicola Hanrahan is undertaking this Linkage Project with Charles Darwin University. It is focussed on the Pine Creek ghost bat colony which is threatened by renewed gold mining but is aiming to establish the current status of ghost bats across Northern Australia.
- **Karstcare** is an ASF supported group led by David Wools-Cobb which conducts protection works in Northern Tasmanian caves. The KCF recently received a donation towards expenses associated with the activities.
- Cave Cricket Biodiversity This project has been extended subject to approval of the Australian Biological Resources Study. Dr Perry Beasley-Hall of Adelaide University is conducting the research.
